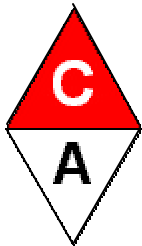

through their donations for the raffle and silent auction. Their generosity allowed us to raise almost \$1500 to help cover the cost of the regatta.

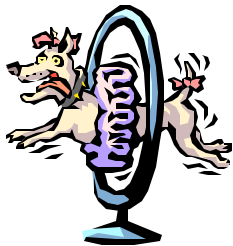
July 3rd in Poulsbo saw nine boats rafted together for the annual fireworks. Great fireworks and great company on the raft.

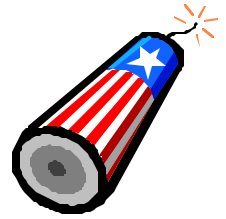

Chesapeake Bay *[Who will go anywhere to race a C30! Ed.]* skipped **Misty II**.

In the handicap fleet we saw our own Bob Parker on **Pisces** out for the first time since he and I fought for last place in the Catalina Regatta around 1997. I won that one, last place that is. Also **Flyin' Scotsman** came down from Everett with Andrew Harvilla to race with us (I race against him in Everett). **Purrin** came across from Bremerton with Wendell Crim at the helm to race. Lastly, **Imagine** sailed up from the Portland area with Bob Gales and his wife Gail to race with us. That earned him a special trophy for "Longest Distance Sailed" *[And CAPS got a warm thank you note from the Gales after the Regatta, which I'll pass around at the next meeting. Ed.]*

In the PHRF classes we had 4 boats in the "small" fleet, and 6 boats in the "big" fleet. The small boats consisted of **Slow Flight**, a C22 with Skip Meisch, **Griot**, a C22 with Russ Milham on the helm, **Good TIDE'ngs II** with our Vice Commodore Bob Armstrong piloting the C25, and **Sojourn**, a C27 with John Ebel its skipper.

In the "big" boats we had our Commodore Dick Eagle flying his new headsail on **Aerie**, a C320, Mark Pywell on **Starbird**, his C34, Tom Madden on **Sea Trek II**, also a C34, John Hamel on his latest **Auntie Beryl**³, the four-owner team of **Chinook**, a C36

skipped by Bill Disney, and an almost new C350 who raced with us last year and has joined CAPS this year, **April IV** helmed by Tim Brogan.

Handicap 30s: 1st **Flyin' Scotsman**, 2nd **Pices**, 3rd **Imagine**, 4th **Purrin**

PHRF – 1: 1st **Slow Flight**, 2nd **Good TIDE'ngs II**, 3rd **Sojourn**. **Griot** did not start.

PHRF – 2: 1st **Sea Trek II**, 2nd **Aerie**, 3rd **Auntie Beryl**³, 4th **Chinook**, 5th **Starbird**. **April IV** did not start.

This means that **Magician** is the 2005 National Champion for the Standard Rig Racing Division, and **Flyin' Scotsman** is the 2005 National Champion for the Standard Handicap Division. **Slow Flight** won for the best overall performance for the Northwest Catalina Regatta. Congratulations to all of the winners this year, and special thanks to the contingency that came all the way up from Houston as well as the IC30A officers. There were so many others, those on the committee boat both days, Jim Hettinger who took all the pictures on the CAPS web site, and especially my long-suffering wife, Nancy, who arranged for the catered dinner Saturday and produced the great barbecue Sunday *[Article elsewhere in this newsletter. Ed.]*

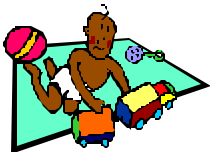

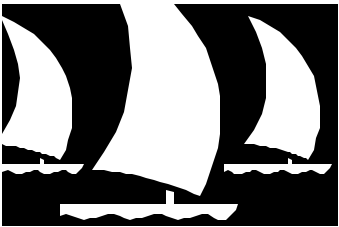
